- Congratulations to Parish Clerk Doreen Joy for securing a huge grant in excess of £24000 for Watson Watt Gardens.
- The boat installed in the Millennium Gardens at the junction near Crayford & Abbs Garage and Tesco's, looks beautiful. The Parish Council are indebted to the lady who kindly donated it to us. Council is also grateful to Councillor Christopher Payne who filled the boat up with shingle and earth before planting was done by the Mundesley Community Gardeners. This organisation was created following an initiative by Mundesley Parish Council. These are the same people who already ensure our village planters look so colourful, so a big thank you to all of them. In the summer the Air Scouts will plant more flowers in the boat as part of their endeavours to earn a badge. This will give the Village another colourful feature.
