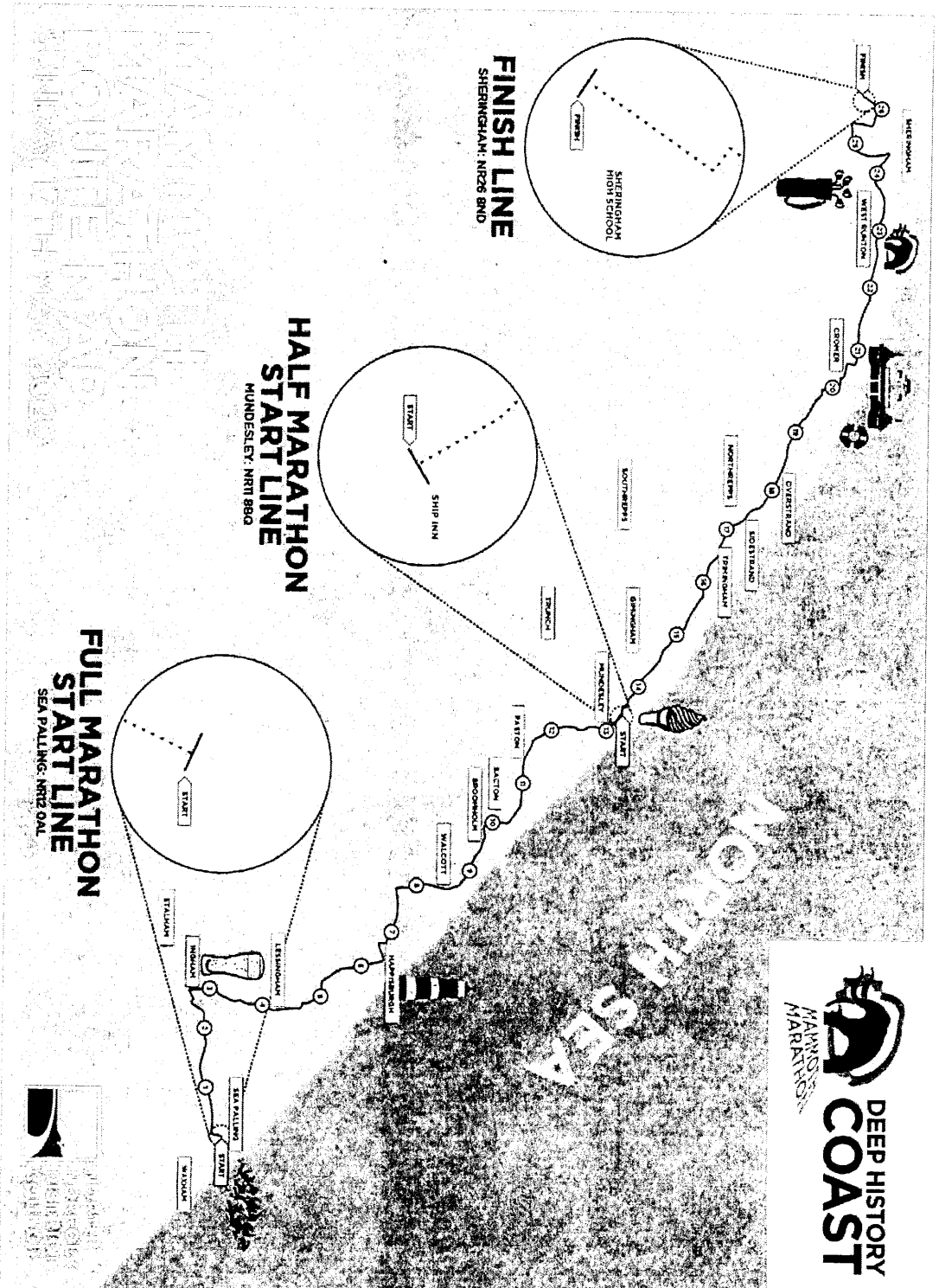

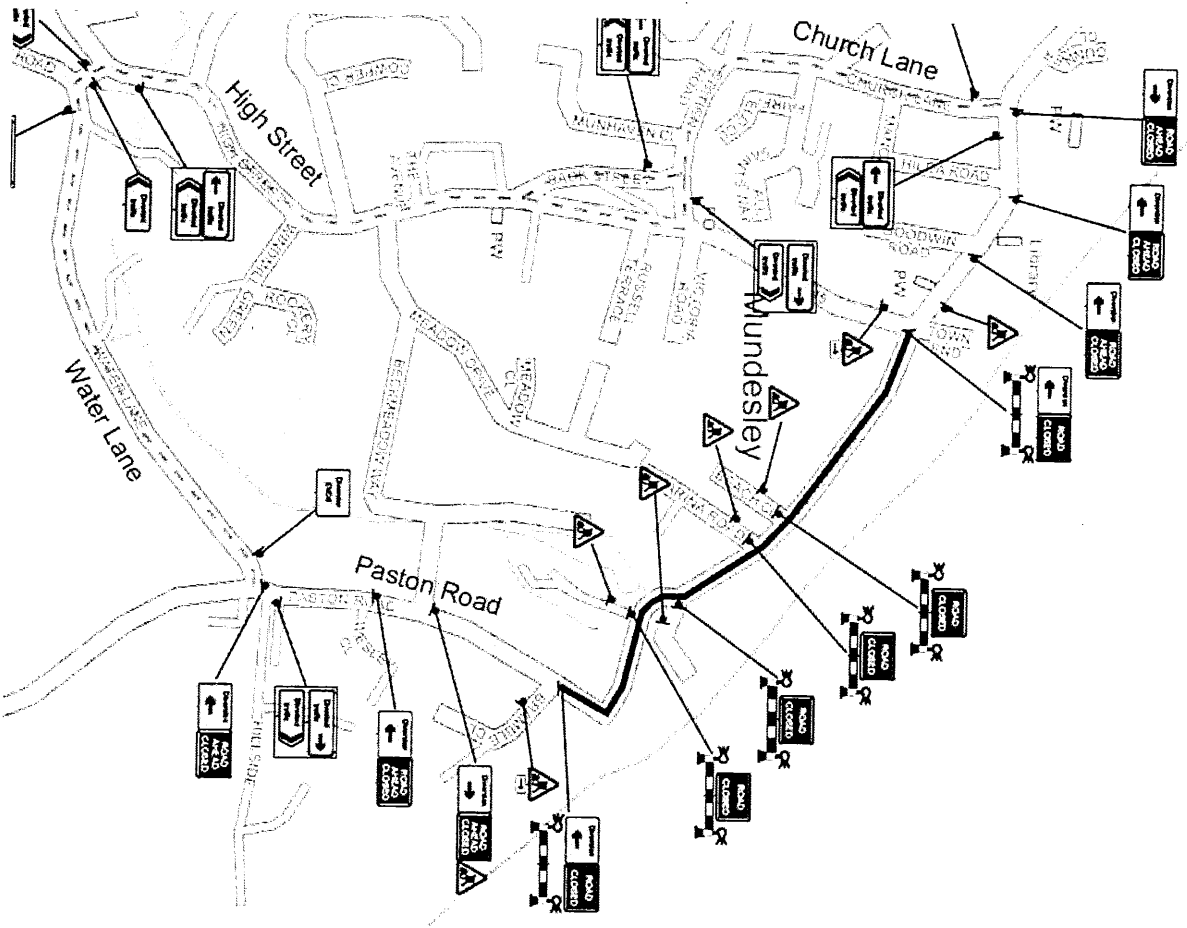
Half Marathon Start - Mundesley

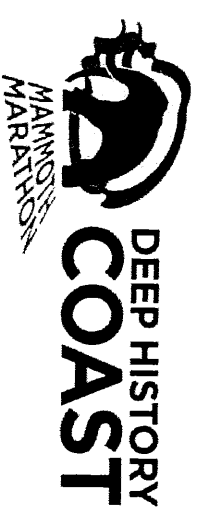
THE ROUTE

Purple area – Possible area for stalls organised by MPC

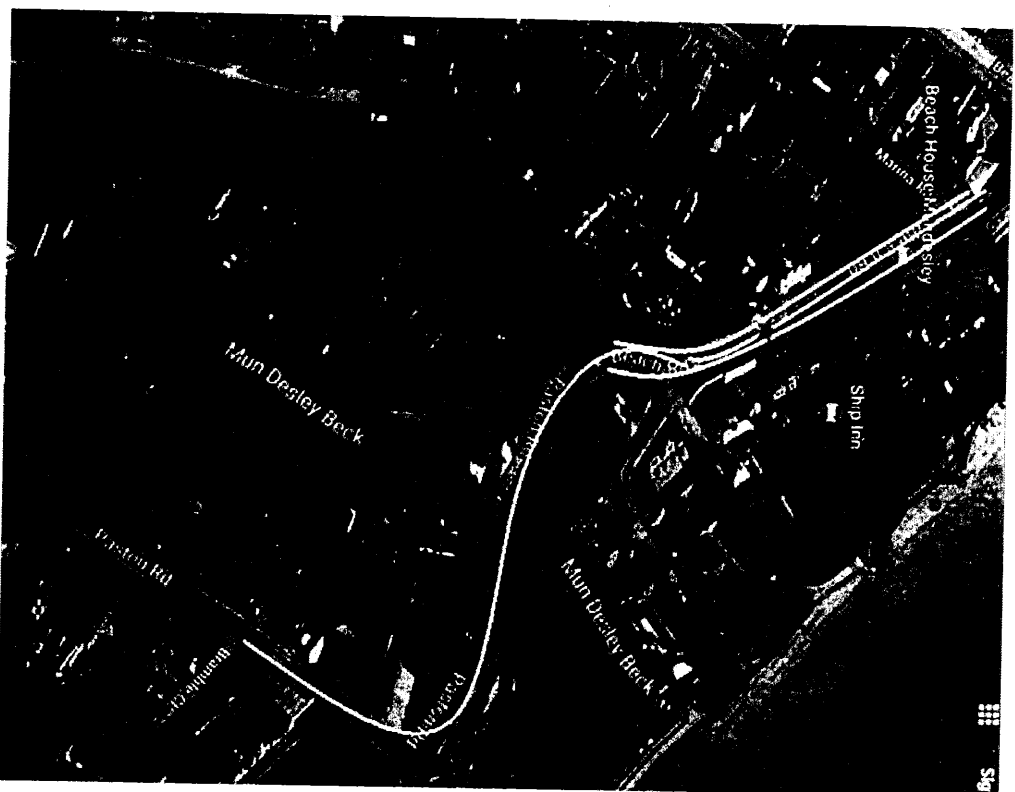
Proposals for management of the start at Mundesley



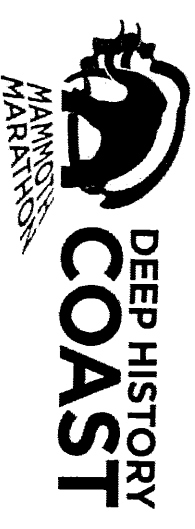
White line – barriers and cones for spectators to stand behind

Proposals for management of the start at Mundesley – itinerary

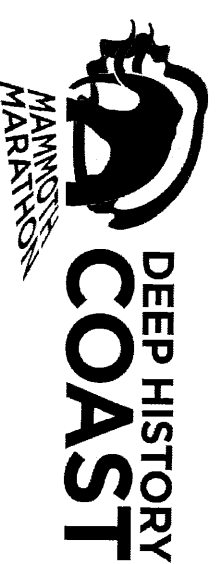


7.30am – soft closure/access only commences

November Council Meeting

The November meeting of the Full Council was held on 25th November. These are always a bit of a pantomime but this one was even more so given that we are in the middle of a General Election. I think in football terms it would be described as 'one for the purists' rather than one that I would encourage a neutral fan to watch (you can watch the proceedings of full council on YouTube if you are keen.)

At the meeting we voted in favour of a new environmental policy which I will give more details of at another time. And in a separate motion we voted in favour of planting lots more trees. The majority voted against supporting WASPI women campaigning for changes to women's pensions. And the majority voted against a motion calling for improved bus services. We voted in favour of a Liberal Democrat motion that aims to give greater prominence to mental health in the Council's public health strategy.

County Council Division

Since my last report in October.

I must apologise for not attending the last parish council meeting, due to a self inflicted burn incident.

Full Council Meeting November 20th 2019

At last weeks meeting we successfully had motions passed to adopted the Mental Health challenge for councils and appoint Cllr Lucy Shires with me supporting as our Mental Health Champion for North Norfolk. We will be working with all areas of the community to see how poor mental health effects people and if we can prevent issues which effect mental health. We will also be identifying the gaps in treatment and seeing where we as a council and society can help.

The council also adopted the Motor Neurone Disease Charter. Again we need to look to helping ease the difficulties and barriers for people with life changing conditions.

The council also agreed to send a letter to the chief executives of the East Anglian Ambulance Service. Firstly reminding them that their staff and first

offenders who are convicted is staggering, custodial sentences of only up to 6 months given, compared to a conviction for cruelty to animals is up to 5 years.

The Local Plan

Cllr Brown and Mark Ashurst are enthusiastic to meet with Mundesley Parish Council regarding the Local Plan to work in partnership.
