## Pebbles



On Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> October an excited party of volunteers made up of staff, committee members and community supporters, started the task of tidying up the Children's Centre at Mundesley. Mundesley was one of the Children's Centres that were closed on the 1<sup>st</sup> October as part of the new programme from Norfolk County Council. Pebbles Children and Family Services, who are a Charity, have been given the opportunity to transform the Centre into a Community Hub for Mundesley and the surrounding areas. Helen oversaw the egg and bacon samies – (and very good they were too); Jo and Hannah sorted through all the resources; Jane cleaned out the staff kitchen, and Josh and Christine were in charge of demolition! We all took an area to be sorted and, with plenty of tea to keep us going, we got started. Catherine, our chairperson, brought all the family along and got stuck into re-painting the reception area with help from Wendy Fredericks from the Liberal Democrats.



The Pebbles Team hope to map out existing services and then provide activities to cover any gaps. Currently there has been interest from Health Visitors to run a clinic and have a hot desk at the Centre; Adult Education to use the large room at the back for training; a new music and movement class for toddlers to start after Christmas, and a holiday club for 8 – 11 year olds to start in February.

Norfolk County Council have set aside funds for repairs to the building, but Pebbles are also applying for grants to support the setting up of the project with the aim to be self-sustaining by 2021. This includes looking at ways to make the building eco-friendlier and reducing running costs. We have therefore put in a bid with the Sheringham Shoal for funds to replace all the lighting with eco-friendly versions. We are very much looking for community involvement and would like to hear from anyone interested in supporting or volunteering with this new project. Please call Caroline on 01263 517986.
