CoastWatch

Mundesley Coastwatch has been serving the village for 24 years. It is a small local charity responsible for raising all of its own funding but it forms part of a UK wide operation. The Coastwatch lookout station is on the upper floor of Mundesley Parish Council's Maritime Museum Building.

Mundesley Coastwatch is fully recognised by Her Majesty's Coastguard (HMCG) as part of the Search and Rescue (SAR) family and it is externally assessed each year on its continued ability to deliver that role.

Coastwatch was established nationally following a fatal incident, involving two fisherman, outside a recently closed Coastguard building in Cornwall because nobody was there to spot, plot and report the incident to the rescue organisations.

Mundesley was the second station in the country to be established and the first station to win the Queens Award for Voluntary Service.

Coastwatch is on duty 365 days a year during daylight hours and has a "spot, plot and report" duty. Incidents that require rescue services are immediately reported to HMCG by Coastwatch and HMCG alerts and directs the rescue services.

Unless an incident is spotted, plotted and reported the rescue organisations cannot be alerted leaving those involved in danger especially if they are unable to call for assistance themselves.

Watchkeepers are fully trained in being able to identify the exact co-ordinates of an incident in order that HMCG can send the relevant organisations to the correct location as quickly as possible, which can be critical. All watchkeepers also undertake certified radio training.

We have around 50 watchkeepers in Mundesley all of whom give their time on a voluntary basis to support Search and Rescue operations. Whilst many of our volunteers live in or near to the village, we do draw our volunteers from a wider area. We are very grateful to all of our volunteers for their time. In addition, we are thankful to the many supporters of Coastwatch - we couldn't do it without you.
